### Consistency of Faith

Any time a group gets together to talk about church business and the health of the church, the topic invariably comes back to those people who used to

come to church and who no longer do. In fact, a lot of research has been done to understand why some churches thrive and others do not.

This summer, Pew Research Center released the results of their most recent investigation into why people attend or do not attend church. Do these answers surprise you?

Why do you go to a religious service?

1. To become closer to God. (81%)
2. So their children will have a moral foundation. (69%)
3. To become a better person. (68%)
4. For comfort in times of trouble or sorrow. (66%)
5. They find the sermons valuable. (59%)
6. To be part of a faith community. (57%)
7. To continue their family's religious traditions. (37%)
8. They feel obligated to go. (31%)
9. To meet new people or socialize. (19%)
10. To please their family, spouse or partner. (16%)

Why do you not go to a religious service?

1. They practice their faith in "other ways." (37%)
2. They are not believers. (28%)
3. No reason is "very important." (26%)
4. They haven't found a house of worship they like. (23%)
5. They don't like the sermons. (18%)
6. They don't feel welcome. (14%)
7. They don't have the time. (12%)
8. Poor health or mobility. (9%)
9. No house of worship in their area. (7%)

Worship is just one of several tangible ways God is present to us, or perhaps *worship is how we see ourselves as being present with God*. What happens in your life after the benediction each week? God is always with us, but are we always with God? Are we the same person inside the church building as we are away from our church family? I want to say yes, but I confess that is not always true. We all have areas to work on, right? Invariably, when someone I meet for the first time finds out I am a pastor, what follows is a “semi-joking” comment about needing to watch their behavior or cleaning up their language. I understand, but I also wonder how often we allow ourselves to be something other than our genuine best self.

Even when people do not attend or belong to a church, generally, they still consider themselves connected to that faith community; especially in smaller areas where there are fewer churches. The church is called to assist families during significant life experiences such as baptisms, weddings, and funerals. Our churches are all happy to provide this kind of care. But how do we activate faith in ourselves and in others the rest of the days of our lives?

The apostles and early Christians also struggled with what we call *consistency of faith*. If we break it down, we can also call this “life stewardship.” God directs us to be stewards of our life and stewards of the earth. Stewardship means:

- Thankfulness for what we have and what God gives us, even the challenges and hardships.
- Balancing our time. Allowing for rest and shared time with our family and friends.
- Gathering with other believers in worship to praise God, to be encouraged, and to also be an encourager to others.
- Study of the Word and personal meditation.
- Serving those we know and serving strangers just because God puts the opportunity before us as a way to learn and grow.
- Praying without ceasing for our grace, for our church family, for our community, for the needs of others.
- Living a transparent Christian life of witness.
- Making it possible for the collective church body to proclaim Christ through giving a portion of our resources.

So the new question to ponder: Are we stewards of the life God has blessed us with?

Do we make our faith life a priority through the week?

Do we use our worship experience as a teaching and learning opportunity?

May God’s peace guide you.



## Westby United Methodist Church - Board Meeting † September 12, 2018

**Present:** Jill Bjornstad, Jane Gaskell, Tim Gaskell, Jean Shore, Ardith Hoff and Linda Weilnau

**Opening:** Tim Gaskell opened with prayer.

**Approval of Minutes:** The minutes of the August board meeting were emailed to the board and published in the September newsletter, so they could be reviewed prior to the meeting. Ardith Hoff and Jean Shore motioned to approve the minutes. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** A treasurer's report was not available during the meeting, but Verna Drake emailed it to the board members after the meeting. Ardith Hoff said that the money collected from her book sales prior to September went to the furnace fund and sales in September and the coming months will go towards the giving baskets. Jane Gaskell reported that \$300 was spent for VBS. \$45 has been spent for the start of Sunday school and there is a balance of \$496.21 in the education account.

### New Business:

Some of these people have decided to not attend our church any more. We need to try and keep track of who is missing each week and contact them.

### Business from Board Committees:

- † **Trustees** – The furnace will be installed next week.
- † **SPRC** – We would like Pastor Pam to let us know, a month in advance, when substitutes are needed so we can try to find the guest speakers from within our congregation.
- † **Worship** – Jane Gaskell and Jill Bjornstad met with Pastor Pam to discuss possible compromises for the worship service. Pastor Pam was receptive to this and adjusted the September communion. She has also adjusted some of the responsive readings for each worship service.
- † **Education** – For VBS, there were 14 students, 4 parents and 9 helpers. It was a good event.

- † **Lay Leadership** – no report
- † **Missions** - Ardith Hoff said that she didn't have any books sales for the month of August.
  - The mission of the month for October will be Operation Christmas Child (OCC), November will be Baskets of Love and December will be Gifts for Norseland Residents

We will send no more than 10 boxes due to shipping costs. We will also use a plastic storage tote which is more durable and can be used for other things. We have been collecting items throughout the year and have lots of toothbrushes, combs, crayons, pencil sharpeners, flashlights, and various small items.


Donations to cover the shipping costs and totes would be greatly appreciated. Any of the following shoebox sized items would work well also: school supplies, hygiene items, and fun toys.

## The Forever Club (by LaVonne Barlow)

### Forever Club Bible Study- The Genealogy of Jesus

October Lesson 16

#### THE CAPTIVITY

The Time period is 600 to 500 hundred years before the birth of Christ. Jerusalem will be destroyed, along with Solomon's Temple. God is using Nebuchadnezzar, a powerful Babylonian king to bring judgment upon his people.

**Captivity is Foretold:** Jeremiah, the prophet of God, tells them they are to serve the King of Babylon and not rebel against him. *Jer. 27:12-18*

**Zedekiah, Judah's last King,** however, he would not take Jeremiah's advice and it says in *II Chron. 36:11-13* that he stiffened his neck against God's advice, in fact he threw Jeremiah in prison. After two years they were defeated. Zedekiah was forced to watch all his sons killed and then his eyes were gouged out, and he was put in prison until he died. King Nebuchadnezzar took over ten thousand princes and chief men as well as skilled craftsmen to Babylon.

**Why was 70 years set as the Captivity time?** The land was to have a Sabbath, according to *Lev. 25:1-4* they were to plant the land for six years and then it was to have a year's Sabbath, so that means that for 490 years they had not obeyed the Land Sabbath as mentioned in *II Chronicles 36:21*

#### DANIEL In Babylon

1. Daniel was a teenager when taken captive to Babylon during the first siege of Jerusalem in 605 B.C.
2. He was of Royal blood
3. While in captivity, without the slightest compromise of his faith, he faithfully served under the administrations of pagan kings, including Nebuchadnezzar, Belshazzar, and Darius in Babylon.
4. He himself was ministered to by both of heaven's recorded archangels Gabriel and Michael.
5. He has more to say about the coming antichrist than any other Old Testament writer.
6. One of his contemporaries, Ezekiel, refers to the righteousness of Daniel, comparing him to Noah and Job *Ezek. 14:14* and also in *28:3* the wisdom of Daniel.
7. Jesus quoted Daniel in His Mt. Olivet discourse in *Mt. 24:15*
8. He may be compared to Joseph, for both men had the gift of interpreting dreams. (*Compare Gen. 37:5, 9; 40:8, 41:25* with *Dan. 2:24; 4:19*)
9. His book marks the third period of miracles in the Bible:
  - a. the time of Moses and Joshua
  - b. the time of Elijah and Elisha
  - c. the time of Daniel
  - d. the time of Christ and His disciples
  - e. the time of Peter and Paul

## Jeremiah In Jerusalem

Jeremiah, the son of a priest was called to service by God at a young age during the reign of Josiah. **Jer. 1:1-9**. His assignment given in **vs. 10**. He was to tell the nations and the kingdoms what their destiny was going to be, were they to be rooted out, pulled down, be destroyed or thrown down and he was to build and plant. He served God in Judah for 42 years before being taken to Egypt along with his scribe Baruch, and the two daughters of Zedekiah, who were of the seed of David. Historical records have them making their way to Spain where one married into the royal family and the other one, TeaTephi married the King of Ireland who was the seed of the twin of the Scarlet Thread a fascinating planting of the Seed of David in the Isles to the West as mentioned often in the Bible where David's throne has flourished for centuries.

**Jeremiah** protested his call, pleading he was too young, but he was assured by God that he had been chosen before he was in his mother's womb and He would always protect him. **Jer. 1:1-9**

He pleaded with Judah to return to God **Jer. 3:6-11 & 26:1-7**

He warned Judah about the coming Babylonian captivity **Jer. 7:15 & 25:11**

He reminded Judah of her many sins **Jer. 7:1-34; 19:5; 44:15-30**

He was commanded to remain unmarried **Jer. 16:2**

He was persecuted when he fearlessly denounced Judah's sin: **by his family Jer. 12:6**; by his hometown **Jer. 11:21** and the religious community **Jer. 20:1,2; 26:8,9 & 37:11-21**

Jeremiah complains to God **Jer. 20:7-18**

He had his original manuscript burned by King Jehoiakim **Jer. 36:1-32**

## The Genealogy of Jesus

Luke 3:25, 26 & 27

Luke 3:27 Neri #53 was the father of Saathiel #54 and he was the father of Zerubabel #55 who was the father of #56 Rhesa, father of #57 Joanna

Luke 3:26 #58 was Juda, father of #59 Joseph who was the father of Semel #60, Mattathias #61 was the father of Maath #62

Luke 3:25 #63 Nagge was the father of #64 Else and he was the father of Naum #65

The Bible does not give any information on any of these fathers except Zerubabel. He was the leader of the tribe of Judah and was called The Prince of the Captives. When King Cyrus of Babylon offered to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem, Zerubabel was one of the first to volunteer and Cyrus chose him to be their leader.

Several reports need to be completed prior to charge conference: SPRC, Pastor Contract, Trustees, Finance, Membership, Lay Servant/Lay Speakers, and Committee on Nominations.

Pastor Pam will provide blank forms or the link to complete the forms online. All forms related to the pastor's contract need to be completed by October 19.

### Committees/Nominations

As we prepare for Charge Conference, church leadership looks at committees and how to match the gifts and graces given by God to individuals with the ministry of the church. In our current structure, every church includes these general committees:

- **Administrative Board** (usually the chairs of other committees, the lay leader, and members at large)
- **Trustees** (responsible for the building and facilities; New Hope and Retreat include a separate team for the parsonage)
- **Finance** (assuring consistent and accurate accounting practices, development of budget, verification of giving for tax purposes)
- **Staff Parish Relations** (works with the pastor to assure productive ministry for the church family and healthy support for the pastor)
- **Membership** (reviews roster for additions of new or preparatory members and removal of inactive or transferred members. Also encouragement and connection with members.)
- **Worship** (guides and assists pastor in development of worship experiences; includes musicians and those who decorate the worship spaces)
- **Education** (develops Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation, and other youth and adult education opportunities)
- **Lay Leader** (a person from each church who is an ad hoc member of committees and who helps the pastor in ministry goals.)

If you have an interest in any of these areas, please let your ad board chairperson know.

Not all of these committees exist at every church. We are looking at other ways to structure administration to reduce the number of meetings and to streamline decision making. ***Certainly, ministry can happen without a committee!!*** And you don't need to be on a committee to participate.

### HOW'S THAT WORKING FOR YOU?

The above is a question made famous by Dr. Phil McGraw of the Dr. Phil show on TV. When people are having problems in their relationships, he likes to ask how their strategy for getting along is working for them. Quite often the guest being interviewed suddenly has to admit that it is not working well at all. One of the usual problems is that one person tries to tell the other person how they should behave. They feel like their take on the problem is correct.

It's like the old joke where a young lady thinks she has married Mr. Right only to discover (to her horror) that he thinks his first name is, "Always". We all like to think we are right most of the time. Some people are so sure that they are right that they never want to admit otherwise, even when proven wrong. Then comes the second question Dr. Phil likes to ask, "Would you rather be right or happy?"

Dr. Phil doesn't mean that you always have to give in and let the other person think they are right all of the time. He simply means that we need to allow for the possibility that the other person might be right some of the time. The only one who is always 100 percent correct is God, and most of us even question that from time to time.

We all know that God answers prayers when we take the time to ask, but we don't always like His answers. The interesting thing is that once we start listening for the right answers, not just the one we want to hear, we realize that we don't always have to be right to be happy. We need to be open to other perspectives—other possibilities.

If you want a better strategy for learning to listen, look for a church where the congregation doesn't pretend to have all the answers, but will help you pray for the right answers for you.
