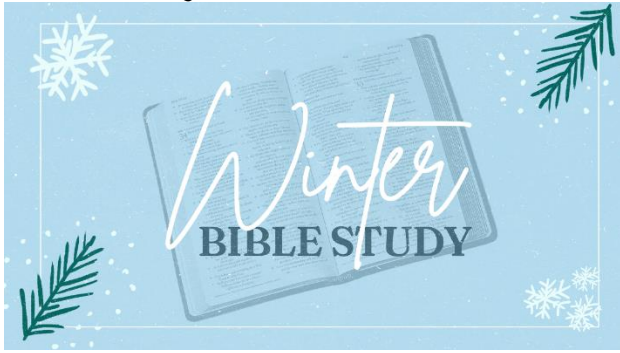
## Annual Church Conferences

### Voices of the Past: A Winter Poem

The words to the right are an excerpt of a three part poem penned in January 1888 for the Vernon County Censor by the Reverend William Haughton (1829 – 1905). May this excerpt of his poem give you hope that despite what may feel like a typical Wisconsin winter filled with snow and cold, the warmth and beauty of spring and summer are on their way and will soon be here.

*Rev. William Haughton served the area of Western Vernon County during the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, including the De Soto and Retreat Congregational churches. He was well loved by the communities he served and was well known for his poetry that he occasionally submitted to the county newspaper. Rev. Haughton later moved to Viroqua by the turn of the century and served as the city's librarian. He was later laid to rest in the Viroqua Cemetery in June 1905, leaving behind his wife, twelve children, seven grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren at the time of his passing.*

**O beautiful night with the pearly zone;  
O stars that gleam by the Master's throne;  
O mists of the northland, shimmering far  
In your waves of light to the polar star,  
What message now through the lonely night  
To the cradled earth in its robe of white?**

**Sleep on, sleep on, for the day draws nigh  
With the vernal dawn and the purple sky,  
When woods shall wave, and the robin sing  
Its joyous song to the tuneful spring;  
The summer comes while a watch we keep  
O'er the silent earth in its restful sleep.**
